A Letter from Father Dave

My dear Sisters and Brothers;

Last January, I celebrated my fortieth anniversary of ordination as a priest. As I ponder those years, I realize most of them have been spent here on the western edge of Livingston County. In the spring of 1992, the Diocese of Lansing bought 20 acres with a house, a barn, a stable and a duplex from Christine Schifko. This property was six miles from St. John in Hartland and six miles from St. Patrick in Brighton.

On June 29, 1993, the feast of the Apostles Peter & Paul, Bishop Povish established a new Catholic Parish in the Diocese of Lansing. He invited all the Catholics who lived in Brighton Township north of I96 to form this new community. On June 30, he assigned the task of creating this new parish to me.

Earlier this year, I began to write the story of those early years. I was reminded of all the hope and enthusiasm that was a part of those early years. I also remembered all the work that went into starting a new community. Most of all, I was reminded of the many people who came and shared in this wonderful undertaking we call St. Mary Magdalen Parish.

The members who formed this community lived in the area for years and others were new to Livingston County. They signed up to serve as Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Singers and Musicians; they volunteered to be Altar Servers and Hospitality. They offered their homes to host meetings and Wednesday evening Liturgies during Lent and Easter. They signed up to be Catechists and Aides in our Religious Formation Program.

People signed up to turn a residence into a rectory with offices, meeting space and a bedroom for the pastor. Folks painted and built, tore down fencing and cleaned out the barn. They responded to the request to serve on Parish and Finance Councils and to organize ministry teams for Worship and Charity & Justice.

There have been so many folks who have done so much over these last twenty-five years. A few of the original 300 plus families are still around. They remember setting up chairs and portable altar furnishings and stacking those same chairs (*twelve to a stack!*) and putting everything away after the last Liturgy.

As many of those original members died or moved away, others came. These parishioners planned buildings and raised money for the construction – not once, but twice. They moved furniture and planned parties, picnics and other celebrations. Most of all, they formed friendships with people who sat near them at Liturgy or worked with them in a variety of ministries. They were also inspired to begin and serve in ministries to feed those in need and reach out to those in need of compassion.

Over these twenty-five years, we have celebrated Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation with both children and adults. We have rejoiced with those who have entered the Sacrament of Marriage and we have mourned and prayed with those who have lost loved ones. We have shared faith with our younger sisters and brothers and with each other in small groups.

We have accomplished so much in twenty-five years. While the buildings are the most visible part of what we have accomplished, the most important part is the community of the faithful that gather inside these buildings.

This year especially, we give thanks to God who has enabled us to accomplish so much over these years. We pray God will enable us to accomplish even greater things in future. But most of all, we pray that God who began this good work, bring it to its fulfillment!
