

ALL THINGS CONSIDERED

FIRST EUCHARIST Next weekend we will celebrate a very important milestone in the lives of 59 young people from our parish and their families. Last weekend they had their retreat to prepare, and it was obvious that many were very excited – a few even knew how many more times they would be coming forward with arms crossed over their chest to show he\she would not be receiving Communion.

First Eucharist will take place at all three Liturgies next weekend. Please join me in praying for these young people. May they grow desire for this great gift.

DSA 2018 The Diocesan Services Appeal (DSA) provides funds for almost 100 different services and programs across the 10 county area of the Diocese of Lansing. Through these services we affect the lives of thousands of people. Services are provided to all 77 parishes, students on three university campuses and several college campuses; prisoners in 10 county jails and several large prisons. There are also six social service agencies providing counseling and substance abuse services. DSA also helps fund the education of future priests, deacons and lay ministers.

Witness to Hope was a campaign to fund several endowments to support the future of several different ministries; DSA funds the day-to-day operation of these ministries.

STAFF CHANGES This spring we will hire a new director of our Preschool and a new bookkeeper. Both positions are part-time. Applications can be found on our website. The last day to apply is **Friday, April 27 by 4:30 pm.**

CHANGE In November I announced my pending 2019 retirement because it was a question that came up frequently. It seemed to be a more honest approach, and it gave both the parish and me time to prepare for my retirement.

Will things change when I leave? Certainly. Every new parishioner, every new staff member brings some degree of change to our community and a change of pastors brings a substantial change. But I am reminded of a saying my dad was fond of repeating: change is like water, too much & you sweep away everything; too little, & everything dries up and dies.

I trust the Holy Spirit to watch over and guide all of us. I trust the Spirit to inspire a good-hearted priest to consider coming here, and I trust all of you to work with him to pastor this community well. I often ponder the words of Jesus, "Fear is useless, what is needed now is trust!" (Mk 9:36)

A SPECIAL MEMORY... A GIFT FROM FATHER DAVE AND OUR WARM WELCOMING COMMUNITY By Jill Angell

We have been parishioners at St. Mary Magdalen since 2003. There are many reasons why we are thankful for finding, and joining, St. Mary Magdalen Parish. The story I describe provides a good example of what the heart of this parish is all about: community, compassion, and caring.

On December 25, 2008, Christmas Day, we lost our son Ryan Michael through miscarriage. It was a horrific experience, filled with sadness, anger, confusion, and loss. However, we discovered some good would come from our loss.

I met with Father Dave to plan a memorial service that would involve the MOMS group. I'll never forget that planning meeting, when just a few ladies from the MOMS group and I met with Father Dave. The first thing that Father Dave said was that he recalled years ago, how the Catholic Church used to have Angel Masses.... Masses dedicated to supporting families who lost children (either through miscarriage, or later in life). He said we would start that as a tradition at St. Mary Magdalen.

Sure enough, later that Fall, the Mass was held around the feast day for Our Lady of Sorrows. It was one of the first Masses celebrated in our new chapel. Each year since, Father Dave has continued to celebrate this Mass. From what people have said, this Mass has comforted them, provided some closure, and that they value the support of the parish over this very difficult event in their lives.

After my miscarriage, our MOMS group bonded even more strongly. It opened the door for discussing the subject of miscarriage in a group where it had not been brought up very much at all. It allowed for a connection, and for sharing and support of the women who had experienced a miscarriage with those who had not, but who empathized with all their heart. This amazing group of women even went as far as having a garden stone made with my son's name engraved in it. This stone is laid near the playground here at St. Mary Magdalen. The playground is another testimony to the compassion in our community, as it honors a mom who died young, who loved children and teaching.

My son's life helped open doors and strengthened bonds. It made me more aware of the anger and struggle people face when their child dies. Through my faith, I witnessed how God worked this sad event, through the warm and welcoming environment of our community, into something beautiful, providing healing and some closure. Healing is not forgetting, but rather using our experiences to glorify God. I hope and pray this beautiful tradition of the Mass of the Little Angels will always be part of St. Mary Magdalen parish. Thank You.

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Peter was originally skeptical about preaching the Gospel to non-Jews. Then one day, the Holy Spirit summoned him to preach to the pagan army officer Cornelius and his household. The result, as we see, is the first recorded conversion of the Gentiles to Christianity.

1 John 4:7-10

The tradition of the apostle John's teachings is expressed in the first letter of John. There is a legend that John in his old age would simply repeat over and over to his people, "Love one another." Today's passage from that letter particularly illustrates this story.

John 15:9-17

The theme of love is taken up again in this Gospel passage. The emphasis, as always in John is on what has been done for us: God has loved us. As there is only one commandment (to love one another), so there is one sin (refusal to love one another). The bottom line is: God is the love that appeared in the person of Jesus and brought us into complete union with the unending goodness. The only response is to love as God loves.

Reflect: This week how can you show love for someone you consider offensive?


