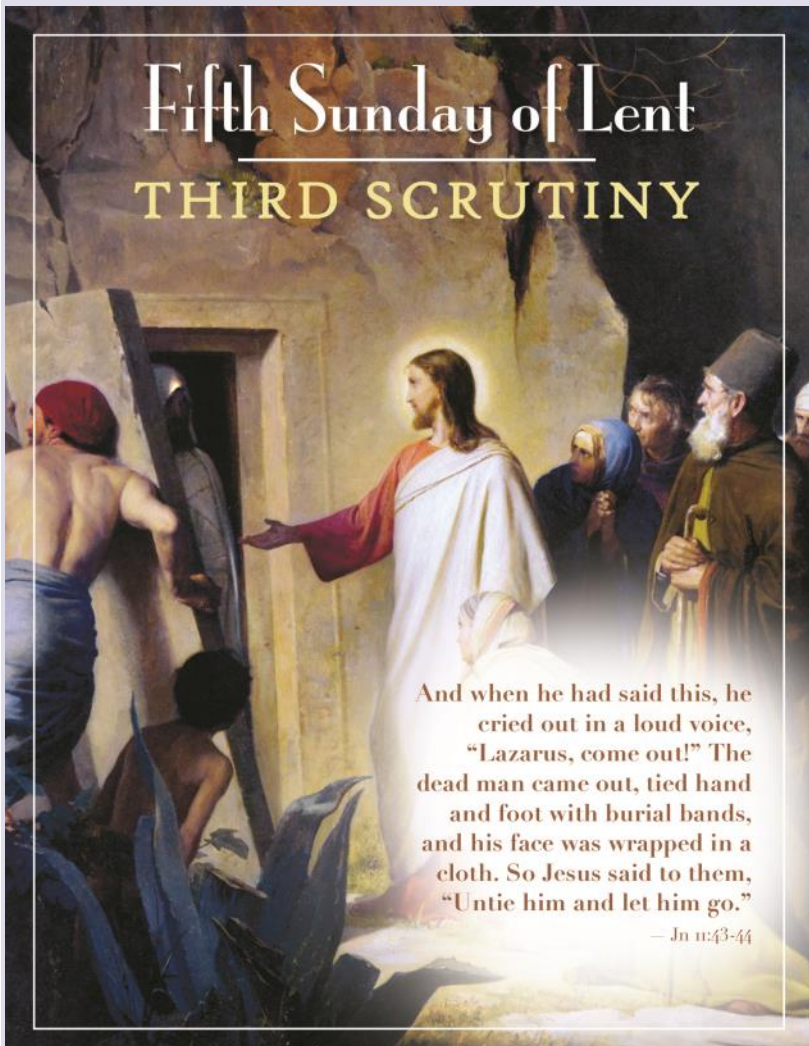

ALL THINGS CONSIDERED

LENT & PENANCE Lent is a time to turn away from sin to live the Gospel more fully. We are invited to ritualize this change of heart by bringing our sin to the Sacrament of Penance.

In these final days of Lent, there are four Communal Celebrations of the Sacrament:

Mon, March 19, (7 pm) Holy Spirit, Hamburg
Wed, March 21 (7 pm) St. John, Hartland

Sat, March 24 (9 am) St. Patrick, Brighton
Mon, March 26 (7 pm) St. Mary Magdalen

In our parish, the Sacrament is celebrated individually, every Saturday of Lent, 11 am - noon.

DIFFERENT VOICES During the season of Lent, a reflection from our own parishioners will be a part of Evening Prayer on Mondays and the Stations of the Cross on Fridays. This week's reflections will be given by Margaret Henne on Monday and Diane Davidson on Friday. Please join us in prayer and be inspired by their heartfelt reflections.

THREE DAYS THAT MATTER The Triduum, the three day celebration of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, will soon be here.

The Triduum celebrates the pass over of the Lord Jesus from death to life, a wonderful truth that is the very core of what we believe as Christians.

Triduum is another name for the special Liturgy that begins on Holy Thursday evening with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. That service does not really end, we simply leave with the Lord to watch & pray with Him until midnight when we disperse as we recall His arrest. The next day, Good Friday, we gather in silence to witness His condemnation and execution. Again, the service does not end, we simply depart until we gather on Holy Saturday evening to witness & celebrate the resurrection.

This year I invite you to truly celebrate your faith by joining in the Triduum (March 29 – 30 - 31).

THE READINGS OF LENT This year, the 3rd, 4th & 5th Sundays of Lent are from Cycle A rather than B, because we have several catechumen preparing for the Sacraments celebrated at the Easter Vigil (the most important Liturgy of the whole year!). The Gospels of these 3 Sundays are from John and invite us to reflect on the 3 Sacraments the catechumen will receive on Holy Saturday: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

This Sunday we meet Lazarus, the friend of Jesus and the brother of Martha and Mary. It is in the midst of the death of Lazarus that Jesus gives us the greatest insight into who He is; as He told both the sisters: Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life! Later, we shared in the Bread of Life!

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Isaiah 50:4-7

Chapters 40 – 55 of the Book of Isaiah contain the message of a prophet who spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon. Several times the prophet speaks about a servant who will one day deliver God's people. Because the Servant is portrayed as suffering, Christians have identified Jesus with him.

Philippians 2:6-11

We have in this passage one of the most beautiful sections of Paul's letter to the Philippians. He wants the members of the community at Philippi to work harder at unity and humility, and to teach this he quotes an early Christian hymn about Jesus.

Mark 14:1 - 15:47

The evangelist Mark sees the Passion of Jesus as the highpoint of his ministry that began after his Baptism by John and the Spirit driving him out into the desert where he was tempted by Satan. Mark's account of Jesus' ministry is brief and to the point but uses 1/5 of the Gospel on the Passion. Mark's intention was to show that Jesus is the suffering servant who is the Son of God. Jesus finds his glory by following the will of God to the cross.

Reflect: What part of the Passion story most touches your life this year?

Religious Formation Registration 2018/2019

We will begin registration for Fall 2018 classes today for our Family Program, then this Wednesday and Thursday for traditional Religious Formation classes. It is important for parishes to host early registrations as our publishers offer great incentives to those who purchase materials early. We encourage all families to register as soon as possible. Children in kindergarten will need to begin Religious Formation in first grade to be on track to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist (First Holy Communion) in the spring of their second grade school year.

Journey with Jesus (JWJ) Vacation Bible School

Some help can be done from home such as decorations, registration, and even putting together craft kits. 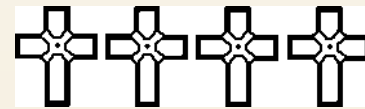

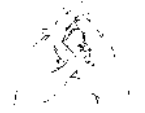
